General Entrance Requirements#

- Hold a recognised post-secondary qualification such as an Associate Degree / Higher Diploma, preferably in areas such as Social Policy and Administration, Business, Management, Event Management, Social Administration, Applied Social Services, Communications, Education and Social Science related areas; or
- Dear final year student of a recognised local Associate Degree / Higher Diploma programme^, preferably in the above-mentioned disciplines (subject to successful completion of the programme with a good GPA); or
- Be a transfer student who has completed at least two years of study of a 4-year-full time degree programme in a recognised institution, preferably in the above-mentioned disciplines; or
- Be a mature applicant (aged 25 or above on 31 August of the year in which applicants commence their studies) who has specific talents, achievements or a wealth of relevant experience; or
- If applicants have completed an associate degree or equivalent in other areas, their applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis

"Applicants should also fulfil English and Chinese language requirements, unless exempted by the University, and pass the admission interview.

Normally, qualification which is of Level 4 or above under Qualifications Register (QR) of the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ).

Otherwise, you may commit serious criminal offences under Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (Cap. 201 of the laws of Hong Kong), which is punishable by imprisonment.

Making, submitting or using any false instrument (including forged documents) are serious criminal offences under the Crimes Ordinance (Cap. 200 of the laws of Hong Kong). A person committing the offences relating to forgery or false instruments is liable on conviction on indictment to imprisonment. The University shall consider the relevant evidence and report suspicious cases to the Hong Kong Police. The University reserves the right to take appropriate legal actions against persons who make, forge or use a false instrument for admission and any other academic purposes before, during and after the admission process.

EdUHK, has not collaborated with any agency in Chinese Mainland or HKSAR on admission, and does not encourage students to entrust their applications to any third-party agents and we always contact applicants directly on updates regarding the applications. You must complete and submit your own application via the EdUHK online admissions system and provide your own personal and contact details. Please refer to the official EdUHK channels, such as programme websites and the admissions system, for the required information to complete your application.

For BSocSc(Psy) & BEd(ECE) and HD(ECE) programmes

EdUHK is one of the teacher education providers in HKSAR. Graduates of the University's teacher education programmes are eligible to apply to become fully qualified Registered Teachers. For registration as a teacher, graduates should approach the Teacher Registration Team of the Education Bureau (EDB) to submit applications directly. All applications will be independently assessed by the EDB which will consider, among other things, whether an applicant has been convicted of any criminal offence (including sex-related offences) in HKSAR or elsewhere, or is involved in any ongoing criminal proceedings or investigations. For details, please browse the EDB's official website.

The University requires students of our full-time teacher education programmes to declare all records of conviction and prosecution of sex-related offence in HKSAR or elsewhere, and report on whether they are involved in any ongoing criminal proceedings or investigations, and to provide relevant details prior to the undertaking of teaching practice. The University reserves the right to deny students with records of conviction or prosecution of sex-related offence attendance or access to the block teaching practice, whereby their graduation requirements of the programmes will not be met.

Students should observe the University's General Code of Student Conduct and the professional conduct and behavior required of teachers. Placement schools and / or invited educators from local schools will observe students' performance during block practices and FE interviews, and their feedback will be considered in determining the final result of the students' field experience.

As a prominent feature of our teacher education programmes, students are required to conduct and pass the Field Experience which lasts up to 18 weeks (for undergraduate programmes) / 16 weeks (for higher diploma programme) during their studies in the programmes. This is a requirement for students' graduation and final registration as a Registered Teacher in HKSAR, subject to the approval of the Education Bureau.

Block Practice will be conducted in local ECE settings registered with school registration certificates. Non-local students may be arranged to conduct their Field Experience at local schools or schools outside HKSAR, according to the placement allocation policy and subject to the availability of such placement. The curriculum of the placement schools should align and comply with the requirements of the EDB Programme Framework. Non-local students are required to bear the respective costs of the Field Experience at schools outside HKSAR, including travel expenses, accommodation fees and other living costs such as meal expenses, personal entertainment, etc. The final decision on the allocation of Field Experience will rest with the Department of Early Childhood Education and/or the relevant Faculties.

The ECE settings where the curriculum aligns with the stipulated settings in the Greater Bay Area (GBA) (for non-local students only, subject to availability of such placement) include:

- the Kindergarten Education Curriculum Guide published by the EDB (e.g. the schools for Hong Kong children 港人子弟學校);
- the Early Learning and Development Guidelines for Children Aged 3 to 6 Years (3-6 歲兒童學習與發展指南) published by the Ministry of Education (e.g. the inclusive kindergartens 普惠性幼兒園); or
- the international educational programmes for children aged 3 to 6 years (e.g. the international schools following the International Baccalaureate curriculum for children aged 3 to 6 years).

For BA(ECFS), BA(HE&AM), BA(SE), BSocSc(Psy) & BEd(ECE), BSc(EM), BSocSc(Psy), BSc(SPR) and HD(ECE) programmes

Students admitted into this programme are required to visit the Greater Bay Area (GBA) and / or other parts of Chinese Mainland. The programme may also require students to participate in other non-local learning experience for completion of the programme. While the visits are subsidised, students are required to contribute part of the estimated cost of the visits ("students' contribution"), whereas any personal entertainment, meals expenses, travel document fee and personal insurance costs shall be at students' own expense. The estimated cost of the visits and students' contribution for students admitted to the coming cohort is yet to be available due to a variety of factors such as inflation of cost of the visits, trip duration, traveling expenses, the exchange rate, etc.
